The jurisdiction of the Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee includes the regulation of healing arts and non-healing arts professions; licensing and enforcement issues for all boards and bureaus within the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA); creation and elimination of agencies, boards and commissions under DCA (i.e., 'Sunrise' and 'Sunset' Review); certain elements of the Department of General Services; charitable solicitations; product labeling (except agricultural and medical); and consumer protection generally.

During the 2013-2014 session of the California State Legislature, the Committee held a total of 40 hearings, including six joint Sunset Review hearings with the Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee.

A total of 221 bills were referred to the Committee during 2013-2014 (123 in 2013 and 98 in 2014). Committee staff authored 199 bill analyses. Of the 221 bills referred, 185 were heard and 181 ultimately passed by the Committee. A substantial majority of the 221 bills referred to the Committee dealt with its primary area of concern – the regulated professions.

Dozens of types of businesses and professions throughout California are regulated by law, including: accountancy; acupuncture; architects; automotive repair; barbering and cosmetology; behavioral sciences; chiropractors; contractors; court reporters; dentists and dental auxiliaries; dispensing opticians; electronic and appliance repair; funeral, cemetery, and crematory establishments; geologists and geophysicists; trainers of guide dogs for the blind; hearing aid dispensers; home furnishings and thermal insulation; interior designers; land surveyors; landscape architects; massage therapy; midwives; naturopathy; nurse assistants; occupational therapists; optometrists; pharmacies and pharmacists; physical therapists; physicians and surgeons; physician assistants; podiatrists; private postsecondary education; professional engineers; professional fiduciaries; psychiatric technicians; psychologists; radiologists; real estate brokers and salespersons; registered nurses; respiratory care providers; security and investigative services; speech-language pathology and audiology; structural pest control; veterinarians and veterinary technicians; and vocational nurses.

The Committee also sees a broad range of legislation that deals with commerce and consumer protection generally, including: advertising, vehicle sales, franchising, self-storage facilities, junk dealers and recyclers, building standards, privacy and consumer technology.

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**TOP 20 ASSEMBLY AND SENATE BILLS REFERRED TO THE  
ASSEMBLY BUSINESS, PROFESSIONS AND CONSUMER PROTECTION  
COMMITTEE DURING THE 2013-2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

**AB 154 (Atkins) Abortion.**

Authorizes a nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, and physician assistant to perform an abortion by aspiration techniques, in addition to medication, in the first trimester of pregnancy upon completion of specified training and validation of clinical competency, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 662, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 370 (Muratsuchi) Consumers: internet privacy.**

Requires privacy policies posted by an operator of a commercial Web site or online service that collects personally identifiable information (PII) to disclose how the operator responds to Web browser "do not track" signals regarding the collection of PII, and to disclose whether other parties may collect PII about an individual consumer's online activities.

Last Action: Chapter 390, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 980 (Pan) Primary care clinics: abortion.**

Requires the California Building Standards Commission, in conjunction with the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development, to repeal certain regulations and sections of the California Building Standards Code that treat primary clinics that provide abortion services differently from those that do not.

Last Action: Chapter 663, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1000 (Wieckowski and Maienschein) Physical therapists: direct access to services: professional corporations.**

Allows patients to access physical therapy services without a referral for 45 calendar days or 12 visits, whichever comes first, after which the patient must receive an in-person examination from a physician and surgeon or podiatrist, who must also sign off on the physical therapist's plan of care; expands the types of licensed professionals permitted to work for a professional corporation; and permits a licensed physical therapist to be a shareholder, officer, or director of a medical and podiatric professional corporation, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 620, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1147 (Bonilla, Gomez & Holden) Massage therapy.**

Substantially revises existing law regulating certified massage therapy professionals, including deletion of the preemption of local massage-related ordinances as they relate to land use, a two-year extension of the sunset date of the California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC) which regulates certified massage therapists, reconstitution of CAMTC's board of directors, the increase of educational standards for certified massage professionals, and the creation of new protections for consumers of massage services.

Last Action: Chapter 406, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1308 (Bonilla) Midwifery.**

Revises the scope of practice for a licensed midwife (LM) to remove the requirement of supervision by a physician and surgeon; authorizes an LM to directly obtain supplies and devices, obtain and administer drugs and diagnostic tests, order testing, and receive reports that are necessary to his or her practice of midwifery; and authorizes an LM to attend cases of normal birth.

Last Action: Chapter 665, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1535 (Bloom) Pharmacists: naloxone hydrochloride.**

Permits a pharmacist to furnish naloxone hydrochloride pursuant to standardized procedures or protocols developed and approved by the California Board of Pharmacy and the Medical Board of California.

Last Action: Chapter 326, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1838 (Bonilla) Healing arts: medical school accreditation.**

Provides that accreditation by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools, or the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation is deemed sufficient to meet existing state curriculum and clinical medical school requirements for the licensure of physicians.

Last Action: Chapter 143, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1852 (Campos) Business: services to minors: background checks.**

Requires a business providing services to minors, including but not limited to academic tutors and instructors of extracurricular activities, to disclose to parents or guardians the business's policies relating to background checks of employees and the type of background check conducted, and exempts certain child care and medical facilities from this requirement.

Last Action: Chapter 159, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2396 (Bonta) Convictions: expungement: licenses.**

Prohibits boards within the Department of Consumer Affairs from denying a professional license based solely on a criminal conviction that has been withdrawn, set aside or dismissed by the court.

Last Action: Chapter 737, Statutes of 2014.

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**SB 465 (Correa) Packaging and labeling: containers: slack fill.**

Revises the definition for "nonfunctional slack fill" prohibited in packaged goods to require that nonfunctional slack fill be substantially less than the allowed capacity, and clarifies a particular exemption to require the actual size of the product be clearly and conspicuously depicted on any side of the exterior packaging, except the bottom.

Last Action: Chapter 429, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 491 (Hernandez) Nurse practitioners.**

Permits a nurse practitioner (NP) to practice independently after a period of physician supervision if the NP has national certification and liability insurance, and authorizes the NP to perform various other specified tasks related to the practice of nursing without protocols.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 493 (Hernandez) Pharmacy practice.**

Expands the pharmacist scope of practice to recognize an "advanced practice pharmacist"; permits pharmacists to furnish certain hormonal contraceptives, nicotine replacement products, and prescription medications for travel; and authorizes pharmacists to independently initiate and administer certain vaccines and treatments for severe allergic reactions.

Last Action: Chapter 469, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 598 (Hill) Biosimilars.**

Permits a pharmacist to substitute a biological pharmaceutical with a biosimilar pharmaceutical in the same manner as generic drugs are substituted, and for prescriptions filled prior to January 1, 2017, requires the pharmacist to notify the prescriber.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 610 (Jackson) Franchises.**

Revises various provisions of the California Franchise Relations Act with respect to termination or transfer of a franchise, as well as the right of association among franchisees.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 809 (DeSaulnier and Steinberg) Controlled substances: reporting.**

Establishes a funding mechanism to update and maintain the Controlled Substance Utilization Review and Evaluation System (CURES) and Prescription Drug Monitoring Program; requires all prescribing health care practitioners to apply to access CURES information; and establishes processes and procedures for regulating prescribing licensees through CURES and securing private information.

Last Action: Chapter 400, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 912 (Mitchell) State property: vending machines.**

Repeals the 2015 sunset date for existing law requiring operators of vending machines on state property to offer at least 35% of food, and approximately 66% of beverages, in a vending machine to meet accepted nutritional guidelines and other nutritional standards, as specified, and makes other technical or nonsubstantive changes.

Last Action: Chapter 571, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 962 (Leno) Smartphones.**

Requires smartphones manufactured after July 1, 2015, and sold in California to contain a technological solution at the time of sale that will render the essential features of the smartphone inoperable when not in the possession of the authorized user, and also

provides a civil penalty for violations and limits retail liability if the solution is circumvented.

Last Action: Chapter 275, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1159 (Lara) Professions and vocations: license applicants: individual tax identification number.**

Prohibits licensing boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs from denying licensure to an applicant based on his or her citizenship or immigration status, and requires a licensing board and the State Bar of California to require, by January 1, 2016, that an applicant for licensure provide his or her individual taxpayer identification number or a social security number for an initial or renewal license.

Last Action: Chapter 752, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1262 (Correa) Medical marijuana.**

Creates the Bureau of Medical Marijuana Regulation in the Department of Consumer Affairs, and establishes a licensing and regulatory framework for the cultivation, transportation, testing, and sale of medical marijuana.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

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**ALL ASSEMBLY BILLS REFERRED TO  
THE ASSEMBLY BUSINESS, PROFESSIONS AND  
CONSUMER PROTECTION COMMITTEE DURING  
THE 2013-2014 SESSION OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATURE**

**AB 44 (Buchanan) Subletting and Subcontracting Fair Practices Act: bidding practices.**

Requires a licensed contractor to include the contractor license number of each subcontractor listed in any bid or offer submitted after July 1, 2014, for the construction of any public work.

Last Action: Chapter 258, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 154 (Atkins) Abortion.**

Authorizes a nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, and physician assistant to perform an abortion by aspiration techniques, in addition to medication, in the first trimester of pregnancy upon completion of specified training and validation of clinical competency, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 662, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 186 (Maienschein) Professions and vocations: military spouses: temporary licenses.**

Requires applicable licensing entities under the Department of Consumer Affairs to provide military spouses and domestic partners who hold a valid professional license in another state with a 12 month provisional license to practice in California.

Last Action: Chapter 640, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 213 (Logue) Healing arts: licensure and certification requirements: military experience.**

Establishes the Veterans Health Care Workforce Act of 2013, which requires schools accredited by healing arts boards within the Department of Consumer Affairs and the State Department of Public Health to accept satisfactory evidence of an applicant's education, training, and practical experience completed during military service towards licensure or certification, as specified.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 230 (Maienschein) Youth athletic programs: background checks.**

Requires a community youth athletic program, beginning January 1, 2016, to provide written notice of its criminal background check policy to the parent or guardian of any youth participating in the program.

Last Action: Chapter 151, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 242 (Chau) Privacy: Internet.**

Requires the privacy policy for a commercial Web site or online service that collects personally identifiable information about its individual consumers residing in California to be no more than 100 words, written in clear and concise language, and written at no

greater than an 8th grade reading level, and to disclose whether that personally identifiable information may be sold or shared with others, and if so, how and with whom.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Judiciary Committee.

**AB 249 (Donnelly) Invasion of privacy.**

Makes technical changes to provisions describing the invasion of privacy resulting from the use of new devices and techniques developed for the purpose of eavesdropping on private communications.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Firearms: open carry prohibitions.

**AB 252 (Yamada and Eggman) Social workers.**

Prohibits an individual from holding himself or herself out professionally as a "social worker" unless he or she has received a degree from an accredited academic institution.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 257 (Hall) Privacy: commercial Web sites and online services.**

Requires an operator of a commercial Web site to include in its privacy policy the uses and retention period for each category of personally identifiable information and the process that allows an individual consumer to review and request changes to any of his or her personally identifiable information. Requires the operator to use reasonable security safeguards to protect personally identifiable information from unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification, or destruction, and to describe these safeguards, as specified.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Judiciary Committee.

**AB 259 (Logue) Health and care facilities: CPR.**

Makes it a misdemeanor for a long-term health care facility, community care facility, adult day health care center, or residential care facility for the elderly, to have a policy that prohibits any employee from administering cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), except when there is a "do not resuscitate" (DNR) form or other similar instructions, as specified

Last Action: Held in Senate Health Committee.

**AB 291 (Nestande) California Sunset Review Commission.**

Abolishes the Joint Sunset Review Committee and establishes the California Sunset Review Commission to assess the continuing need for government agencies, as specified.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review Committee.

**AB 299 (Holden) Prescription drug benefits.**

Prohibits pharmacies from contracting with a health care service plan or disability insurer that requires mail-order only service, or imposes an opt-out process for mail-order service.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 370 (Muratsuchi) Consumers: internet privacy.**

Requires privacy policies posted by an operator of a commercial Web site or online service that collects personally identifiable information (PII) to disclose how the operator responds to Web browser “do not track” signals regarding the collection of PII, and to disclose whether other parties may collect PII about an individual consumer’s online activities.

Last Action: Chapter 390, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 399 (Fox) Clinical laboratories.**

Authorizes the State Department of Public Health to charge appropriate license fees whenever it determines that a new category of licensure is necessary to direct a laboratory or to perform clinical laboratory tests or examinations in specific specialties or subspecialties.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 404 (Eggman) Healing arts: behavioral sciences: retired licenses.**

Reduces from five to three the number of years a licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed educational psychologist, licensed clinical social worker and licensed professional clinical counselor licensee may have to restore his or her retired license to active status without reapplication or re-examination, and clarifies that an inactive license may be eligible for a retired license, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 339, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 428 (Eggman) Healing arts: marriage and family therapists: clinical social workers: coursework.**

Authorizes certain coursework requirements for licensure as a licensed marriage and family therapist and licensed clinical social worker to be completed through continuing education instead of formal classroom training, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 376, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 429 (Daly) Real Estate Commissioner: powers.**

Requires the Real Estate commissioner to enforce the provisions and to pursue violations of the Real Estate Law and the Subdivided Lands Law.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 433 (Gordon) Contractors: fire protection systems: fire safety: State Fire Marshal.**

Authorizes licensed plumbing contractors to install residential fire protection systems for single- and two-family homes through January 1, 2017.

Last Action: Chapter 377, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 451 (Eggman) Healing arts: therapists and counselors: licensing.**

Extends the current effective date for new education, examination and eligibility requirements for out-of-state applicants for licensed marriage and family therapist and licensed professional clinical counselor licenses from January 1, 2014 to January 1, 2016, and extends the operation and repeal date for current examination, eligibility and curriculum requirements for out-of-state applicants from January 1, 2014 to January 1, 2016.

Last Action: Chapter 551, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 459 (Mitchell) Public contracts: healthy and sustainable food.**

Revises the current "accepted nutritional guidelines" for food and beverages in a vending machine on designated state property, and requires the food and beverages to reach 50% compliance with the revised guidelines beginning January 1, 2015, 75% compliance on January 1, 2016, and 100% compliance on and after January 1, 2017.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 467 (Stone) Prescription drugs: collection and distribution program.**

Establishes a license and regulatory framework for a "surplus medication collection and distribution intermediary" to facilitate the donation of surplus medications in California.

Last Action: Chapter 10, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 469 (Wagner) Telephonic sellers: loan modifications.**

Redefines "telephonic seller" to include a person making a telephone solicitation to arrange or assist in the arrangement of a loan modification, for purposes of an existing law that mandates the registration and regulates the practices of telephonic sellers, and requires those telephonic sellers to file with the Department of Justice specified information for persons who obtained loan modifications for those who responded to the seller's solicitations or representations.

Last Action: Held in Senate Banking and Financial Institutions Committee.

**AB 480 (Ian Calderon) Service contracts.**

Includes optical products in the current definition of a retail service contract, which would require agreements for pre-paid services relating to the replacement, maintenance or repair of prescription and non-prescription eyewear to be in a written contract, among other duties.

Last Action: Chapter 421, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 496 (Gordon) Medicine: continuing medical education: sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.**

Includes information pertinent to the appropriate care and treatment of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex communities in recommended continuing medical education (CME) requirements for cultural competency, and authorizes associations that accredit CME courses to update continuing education standards as needed.

Last Action: Chapter 630, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 509 (Blumenfield) Consumer affairs.**

Makes unlawful under the Consumers Legal Remedies Act the representation of a product as designed, made, or both in a specific city or county, by using a specified "made in" label if the product does not comply with specified standards.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 512 (Rendon) Healing arts: licensure exemption.**

Extends from 2014 to 2018 the sunset date of the California licensure exemption for health care practitioners who are licensed or certified in other states and who provide health care services on a voluntary basis to uninsured or underinsured persons in California, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 111, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 536 (Wagner) Contractors: payments.**

Excludes claims for additional compensation from the definition of a "disputed amount" for purposes of existing law that authorizes, in the event of a good faith dispute, the withholding of 150% of a disputed amount from certain payments to contractors and subcontractors.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Judiciary Committee.

**AB 555 (Salas) Professions and vocations: military and veterans.**

Requires a board within the Department of Consumer Affairs to consider, and authorizes a board to accept for purposes of satisfying licensure requirements, any relevant training an applicant has received during his or her service in the armed forces of the United States, if applicable to licensure requirements, and authorizes a board to consult with the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Military Department when evaluating whether that training is applicable to licensure requirements.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Social security numbers.

**AB 630 (Holden) Architects.**

Prohibits a person from using an architect's instruments of service without a written contract or written assignment authorizing that use; prohibits an architect from unreasonably withholding consent from the architect's client to use those instruments of service; and specifies that an architect may reasonably withhold consent if full payment has not been made, or if the conditions of the written contract have not been fulfilled.

Last Action: Chapter 453, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 634 (Gomez) Private postsecondary education: avocational education.**

Requires the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE) to promulgate regulations to clarify the definition of avocational education for the purpose of the statute that establishes BPPE and its authority.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Public records: exception to disclosure: public officials.

**AB 670 (Atkins) Pharmacy Law: incentive payments.**

Prohibits a pharmacist or pharmacy employer from receiving compensation for recommending or replacing a patient's originally prescribed drug with a therapeutic alternative, unless the recommendation is part of a comprehensive medication review.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 704 (Blumenfield) Emergency medical services: military experience.**

Requires the Emergency Medical Services Authority to adopt regulations by January 1, 2015, to accept the military education, training, and practical experience of applicants, as specified, towards certification as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-I and EMT-II, and towards licensure as an EMT-Paramedic.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 705 (Blumenfield) Combat to Care Act.**

Requires the Board of Registered Nursing to promulgate regulations that identify the military education, training, and experience that is equivalent or transferable to coursework required for licensure as a registered nurse and, upon receipt of an applicant's record of education, training, and experience completed in the Armed Forces, provide the applicant with a list of coursework, if any, that the applicant must complete for license eligibility.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 759 (Daly) Alarm companies.**

Expands the locksmith licensure exemption to include a person who is licensed, certified, or registered with the Bureau of Security and Investigative Services pursuant to the Alarm Company Act, if the locksmithing duties of that person are performed in combination with the installation or maintenance of an alarm system, as specified, and limited to work on electronic locks or access control devices that are controlled by an alarm system.

Last Action: Chapter 14, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 764 (Linder) Human Remains.**

Establishes a pilot program that authorizes the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau to offer a limited crematory license to no more than five alkaline hydrolysis facilities as specified, and repeals that authority on January 1, 2020.

Last Action: Held in Senate Environmental Quality Committee.

**AB 791 (Hagman) Collateral recovery: reposseors.**

Prohibits a reposessor from selling repossessed collateral or accepting payment from a debtor in lieu of repossession, forbids a repossession agency from disclosing personal employee information, as specified, and authorizes a reposessor to wear certain identification, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 340, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 801 (Brown) Junk dealers and recyclers: nonferrous materials.**

Requires junk dealers and recyclers to obtain certain information before providing

payment for nonferrous materials marked with indicia of ownership, and requires that information to be retained as part of the written record of purchase.

Last action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 808 (Fong) Acupuncture: license requirements.**

Requires applicants for an acupuncture license to pass a practical examination in addition to the existing written examination beginning January 1, 2016.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 809 (Logue) Healing arts: telehealth.**

Revises the informed consent requirements relating to the delivery of health care via telehealth by permitting consent to be made verbally or in writing, and by deleting the requirement that the health care provider who obtains the consent be at the originating site where the patient is physically located.

Last Action: Chapter 404, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 811 (Lowenthal) Excavations: regional notification center system: contractor certification.**

Requires regional notification centers to compile and make available on their Internet Web sites an annual report based on statewide information from operators and excavators regarding mishaps and violations related to excavation.

Last Action: Chapter 250, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 830 (Holden) Clinical laboratories.**

Requires the State Department of Public Health to promulgate regulations to require any facility operating a clinical laboratory that employs clinical laboratory scientists and medical laboratory technicians to provide specified training to those individuals and any other employees charged with supervising those individuals.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 836 (Skinner) Dentists: continuing education.**

Restricts the continuing education requirement hours for retired active dentists who provide only uncompensated care at a maximum of 60% of that required for non-retired active dentists, and requires the Dental Board of California to report on the status of retired active dentists who provide only uncompensated care during its next sunset report.

Last Action: Chapter 299, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 841 (Torres) Junk dealers and recyclers: nonferrous materials: payment.**

Requires a junk dealer or recycler to pay a seller of nonferrous materials by mailed check only, and prohibits sellers from picking up a cash or check payment in person.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 851 (Logue) Dentistry: licensure and certification requirements: military experience.**

Requires the Dental Board of California to accept any education, training, or practical experience completed by an applicant in military service if it is equivalent to the licensure standards of the board, as specified, and requires certain schools seeking accreditation or approval to have procedures to accept an applicant's military education, training, and practical experience toward the completion of a board-approved educational program by July 1, 2014.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 854 (Stone) Locksmithing.**

Requires a locksmith, , to obtain the e-mail address of the person requesting or purchasing the key, in addition to other information, when making a key for a residence or commercial establishment, and increases the retention of the work order from two to four years.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 864 (Skinner) Athletic trainers.**

Establishes the Athletic Training Practice Act to license and regulate athletic trainers through the creation of an Athletic Trainer Licensing Committee under the Physical Therapy Board of California, to commence on July 1, 2014 and expire on January 1, 2019.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 867 (Yamada) Aeronautics: meteorological towers: markings.**

Requires, by January 1, 2015, meteorological towers located outside the boundaries of an incorporated city, or on or within one mile of prime agricultural land, to be marked, as specified.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 890 (Jones) False advertising.**

Aligns California with the federal standard regarding the use of the terms "Made in U.S.A.," "Made in America," "U.S.A." or similar words when a product or any portion of the product was not substantially produced in the United States.

Last Action: Held in Senate Judiciary Committee.

**AB 916 (Eggman) Healing arts: false or misleading advertising.**

Prohibits a physician from using the terms "board," "certified," or "certification" in advertising unless those terms are used in reference to a certifying board that meets specified criteria.

Last Action: Held in Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee.

**AB 964 (Bonta) Vehicles: dealers.**

Prohibits a vehicle from being advertised or sold if the dealer knows or should have known that the vehicle is subject to a manufacturer's safety recall, allows non-certified used vehicles to be sold if accompanied by a written disclosure, and requires dealers who sell vehicles at retail to provide buyers with written disclosure identifying whether certain conditions are present, if the dealer knows or should know of that condition, except as specified.

Last Action: Held on Assembly Floor.

**AB 980 (Pan) Primary care clinics: abortion.**

Requires the California Building Standards Commission, in conjunction with the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development, to repeal certain regulations and sections of the California Building Standards Code that treat primary clinics that provide abortion services differently from those that do not.

Last Action: Chapter 663, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 983 (Melendez) Self-service storage facilities.**

Revises the California Self-Service Storage Facility Act to allow self-service storage facility owners to have a vehicle, watercraft, or trailer towed from the facility if rent and other charges have not been paid for 60 days, provided the facility owner sends the occupant a 10-day advance notice, as specified; and provides for additional rights, duties, and obligations in a rental agreement, including the right to limit the value of property an occupant may store in the storage space.

Last Action: Chapter 778, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 993 (Linder) Contractors: arbitration.**

Revises and updates the provisions relating to the Contractors State License Board's arbitration program that provides for an alternative dispute resolution process between consumers and contractors for claims up to \$50,000; clarifies the arbitration process, the arbitrator's authority, and the awarding of attorney's fees, as specified; and makes other clarifying, technical and conforming changes.

Last Action: Held in Senate Judiciary Committee.

**AB 1000 (Wieckowski and Maienschein) Physical therapists: direct access to services: professional corporations.**

Allows patients to access physical therapy services without a referral for 45 calendar days or 12 visits, whichever comes first, after which the patient must receive an in-person examination from a physician and surgeon or podiatrist, who must also sign off on the physical therapist's plan of care; expands the types of licensed professionals permitted to work for a professional corporation; and permits a licensed physical therapist to be a shareholder, officer, or director of a medical and podiatric professional corporation, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 620, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1003 (Maienschein) Professional corporations: healing arts practitioners.**

Authorizes any person licensed under the Business and Professions Code, the

Chiropractic Act, or the Osteopathic Act to be employed to render professional services by a professional corporation, as specified.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1013 (Gomez) Consumer affairs.**

Authorizes an employee designated by the Attorney General , to represent the interests of consumers and present evidence and arguments before an agency, court or department when the Attorney General has intervened in a pending matter or proceeding before any agency, court, or department.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1017 (Gomez) Incoming telephone calls: messages.**

Requires a state agency to establish a procedure for incoming phone calls that will enable a caller to leave a message, and further requires that the message be returned within 3 business days, or 72 hours, whichever is earlier.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1028 (Patterson) Vocational nursing: interim permits.**

Authorizes an applicant for licensure as a vocational nurse to submit an application for an interim permit at the same time as the applicant submits his or her application for licensure by examination, and requires the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians to issue the interim permit, if it chooses to do so, within 60 days of receiving the completed application.

Last Action: Chapter 301, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1045 (Quirk-Silva) Sterile compounding and nonresident pharmacies.**

Requires a recipient pharmacy, prescriber, or patient of a recalled drug and the California Board of Pharmacy to be notified within 12 hours of a recall notice for a sterile compounded drug, and requires the automatic suspension, cancellation, or revocation of a California pharmacy license if an out-of-state pharmacy's home state license is suspended, cancelled, or revoked.

Last Action: Chapter 302, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1057 (Medina) Professions and vocations: licenses: military service.**

Requires licensing boards within the Department of Consumer Affairs, beginning January 1, 2015, to ask on every application for licensure if the applicant is serving in, or has previously served in, the military.

Last Action: Chapter 693, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1063 (Eggman) Surveyors and engineers.**

Provides title protection for city and county engineers and surveyors by prohibiting the use of the title engineer or surveyor unless an individual is a licensed professional engineer or professional surveyor; authorizes a licensed surveyor or civil engineer to

include additional information filed with a record of survey, as specified; and requires a local public agency's land survey marker to identify the land surveyor or civil engineer that set it.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 1095 (Nestande) Junk dealers and recyclers: nonferrous materials.**

Requires a junk dealer or recycler to provide payment to the seller of nonferrous materials by check only and no sooner than 30 days after the date of sale, unless the seller meets specified criteria, and prohibits a junk dealer or recycler from selling or disposing of those materials for 30 days.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1114 (Achadjian) Contractors: home improvement contracts.**

Repeals the prohibition against contractors paying, crediting, or allowing any consideration or compensation of any kind to any other contractor or salesperson other than a licensee for, or on account of, the performance of a work of improvement or services, including, but not limited to, home improvement services.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1136 (Levine) Pharmacists: drug disclosures.**

Requires a pharmacist, on and after January 1, 2014, if a pharmacist exercising his or her professional judgment determines that a drug may impair a person's ability to operate a vehicle or vessel, to include a written label on the drug container indicating that the drug may impair a person's ability to operate a vehicle or vessel. Permits the label to be printed on an auxiliary label that is affixed to the prescription container. Makes other technical and clarifying changes.

Last Action: Chapter 304, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1139 (Lowenthal) Prescriptions: biosimilar products.**

Permits a pharmacist to substitute a biological pharmaceutical product with a comparable biosimilar product, provided that biosimilar product is deemed by the federal Food and Drug Administration to be interchangeable with the prescribed biological product.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1141 (Dahle) Franchises.**

Establishes the Small Business Investment Protection Act of 2013, which revises and recasts the relationship between a franchisee and a franchisor.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Judiciary Committee.

**AB 1147 (Bonilla, Gomez & Holden) Massage therapy.**

Substantially revises existing law regulating certified massage therapy professionals, including the deletion of the preemption of local massage-related ordinances as they

relate to land use, a two-year extension of the sunset date of the California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC) which regulates certified massage therapists, reconstitution of CAMTC's board of directors, the increase of educational standards for certified massage professionals, and the creation of new protections for consumers of massage services.

Last Action: Chapter 406, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1153 (Eggman) Barbering and cosmetology.**

Authorizes the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology to offer a master esthetician skin care license, establishes educational and practical requirements for the examination and application, and modifies the scope of practice of cosmetology and esthetic skin care.

Last Action: Held on Senate Floor.

**AB 1174 (Bocanegra and Logue) Dental professionals.**

Authorizes certain allied dental professionals to perform additional activities using telehealth; extends the duration of the Health Workforce Pilot Project No. 172 until January 1, 2016; and prohibits Medi-Cal from requiring a face-to-face visit between a patient and provider before allowing teledentistry services.

Last Action: Chapter 662, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1177 (Bocanegra) Structural fumigation.**

Extends to January 1, 2018 the sunset date for the Structural Fumigation Enforcement Program (Program) under the Department of Pesticide Regulation for Los Angeles, Orange, Santa Clara, and San Diego Counties; increases from \$5 to \$8 the fee paid under the Program; revises certain reporting requirements; and authorizes a county agricultural commissioner to require payment of delinquent fees, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 596, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1215 (Hagman and Holden) Clinical laboratories.**

Redefines the term "laboratory director" to authorize a licensed clinical laboratory scientist to operate as the director of a clinical laboratory when performing simple tests exempted from the federal Clinical Laboratory Improvements Amendments of 1988.

Last Action: Chapter 199, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1236 (Hagman) Contractors: limited liability companies.**

Authorizes a licensed contractor organized as a limited liability company (LLC) to obtain limited liability insurance from an eligible surplus line insurer licensed in another state, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 114, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1260 (Medina) California family owned business.**

Creates a formal definition for a "California family owned business" to serve as the basis for better data collection on the contribution that family owned businesses make to the California economy.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 1269 (Gray) Medicine: special faculty permit.**

Clarifies that the Medical Board of California, and not the nonexistent Division of Licensing, may establish an applicant's eligibility for a special faculty permit to practice medicine exclusively within a medical school and any affiliated institution.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1278 (Hueso) Integrative cancer treatment.**

Prohibits a physician from recommending, prescribing, or providing integrative cancer treatment, as defined, to cancer patients unless certain requirements are met.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Health Committee.

**AB 1288 (V. Manuel Pérez) Medical Board of California and Osteopathic Medical Board of California: licensing: application processing.**

Requires the Medical Board of California and the Osteopathic Medical Board of California to develop a priority review process for applicants for a physician and surgeon's certificate who demonstrate their intent to practice in a medically underserved area or serve a medically underserved population, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 307, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1308 (Bonilla) Midwifery.**

Revises the scope of practice for a licensed midwife (LM) to remove the requirement of supervision by a physician and surgeon; authorizes an LM to directly obtain supplies and devices, obtain and administer drugs and diagnostic tests, order testing, and receive reports that are necessary to his or her practice of midwifery; and authorizes an LM to attend cases of normal birth.

Last Action: Chapter 665, Statutes of 2013.

**AB 1439 (Salas) Unfair business practices: contests and sweepstakes.**

Prohibits any person from using an electronic video monitor to simulate gambling or play gambling-themed games that offers the opportunity to win sweepstakes cash, cash equivalent prizes, or other prizes of value when conducting a contest or sweepstakes.

Last Action: Chapter 592, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1535 (Bloom) Pharmacists: naloxone hydrochloride.**

Permits a pharmacist to furnish naloxone hydrochloride pursuant to standardized procedures or protocols developed and approved by the California Board of Pharmacy and the Medical Board of California.

Last Action: Chapter 326, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1551 (Holden) Professional engineers and land surveyors: documents.**

Prohibits a person from using a licensed engineer's documents or a licensed land surveyor's maps, plats, reports, descriptions, or other documentary evidence, as

specified, without written consent, and prohibits a licensed engineer or land surveyor from unreasonably withholding consent to use those documents.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1608 (Olsen) Private investigators: limited liability companies.**

Authorizes a licensed private investigator to organize as a limited liability company (LLC) until January 1, 2018; requires a private investigator that is an LLC to maintain liability insurance, as specified; and makes technical, updating and conforming changes.

Last Action: Chapter 669, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1627 (Gomez) Fees for state services.**

Requires an individual who charges a fee for performing or facilitating the performance of a free service provided by the state to disclose that the state does not charge a fee for providing that service.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Vehicles: registration services: disclosure of service fees.

**AB 1665 (Jones) Automotive repair.**

Authorizes the Bureau of Automotive Repair to regulate businesses that change and repair tires as an automotive repair dealer (ARD), and requires ARDs that repair tires or change tires, if a vehicle is manufactured with a tire pressure monitoring system (TPMS), to be capable of diagnosing and servicing the TPMS.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 1685 (Williams) Structural pest control operators: fees.**

Increases the statutory maximum for licensure examination fees charged by the Structural Pest Control Board from \$25 to \$100 for operator examinations; from \$15 to \$75 for field representative examinations; and from \$15 to \$60 for applicator examinations.

Last Action: Chapter 304, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1702 (Maienschein) Professions and vocations: incarceration.**

Specifies that an individual who has satisfied the requirements for licensure while incarcerated and who applies for licensure after release shall not have his or her application delayed or denied solely based on the prior incarceration, and exempts the Board of Chiropractic Examiners from these requirements.

Last Action: Chapter 410, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1732 (Stone) Vehicles: manufacturers, distributors, and dealers.**

Prohibits a licensed vehicle manufacturer, transporter, or dealer from advertising a vehicle's prior use or ownership history in an inaccurate manner, and prohibits licensed vehicle dealers from advertising two conflicting rebate deductions or advertising using the word "rebate" unless the rebate is directly offered by an affiliated finance company, regulated utility or government entity.

Last Action: Chapter 856, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1735 (Hall) Nitrous oxide: dispensing and distributing.**

Makes it a misdemeanor for any person to dispense or distribute nitrous oxide to a person if the dispenser knows or should know that the nitrous oxide will be ingested or inhaled by the person for the purposes of causing intoxication, and that person proximately causes great bodily injury or death to himself, herself, or any other person.

Last Action: Chapter 458, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1747 (Holden) Massage Therapy.**

Makes numerous and substantive changes to the operations and requirements of the California Massage Therapy Council and authorizes local jurisdictions to make substantive changes to local ordinances regarding the regulation and oversight of massage therapy establishments and professionals.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1758 (Patterson) Healing arts: initial license fees: proration.**

Requires several licensing boards and committees within the Department of Consumer Affairs to prorate initial license fees on a monthly basis, and would authorize those boards and committees to impose an additional fee to cover the costs of issuing an initial license.

Last Action: Held in Senate Appropriations Committee.

**AB 1809 (Maienschein) Dogs: health certificates.**

Requires a person seeking to bring a dog into California for resale or change of ownership to obtain a health certificate from a licensed veterinarian, dated within ten days prior to the dog's arrival, and submit the certificate to the county health department, and establishes a penalty for violating the requirement to obtain and submit a health certificate.

Last Action: Chapter 498, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1810 (Maienschein) Deposits for keeping: abandoned animals.**

Permits a veterinarian or animal care facility to turn over an abandoned animal to a public animal control agency or shelter rather than euthanize it, as long as the shelter has not refused to take the animal, and deletes the requirement that an abandoned animal be euthanized 10 days after abandonment.

Last Action: Chapter 86, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1823 (Wagner) Contractors: payments.**

Excludes claims for additional compensation from the definition of a "disputed amount" for purposes of existing law that authorizes, in the event of a good faith dispute, the withholding of 150% of a disputed amount from certain payments to contractors and subcontractors.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1832 (Ian Calderon) Ticket sellers: equitable ticket buying process: sale or use of circumventing software.**

Makes technical changes to existing law prohibiting software from circumventing ticket sellers' equitable ticket buying process to ensure the prohibition extends beyond Internet Web sites.

Last Action: Chapter 158, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1838 (Bonilla) Healing arts: medical school accreditation.**

Provides that accreditation by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools, or the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation is deemed sufficient to meet existing state curriculum and clinical medical school requirements for the licensure of physicians.

Last Action: Chapter 143, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1841 (Mullin) Medical assistants.**

Clarifies that medical assistants may hand out properly labeled and prepackaged prescription drugs to patients as part of their existing authorization to provide "technical supportive services" in specified non-state operated facilities.

Last Action: Chapter 333, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1852 (Campos) Business: services to minors: background checks.**

Requires a business providing services to minors, including but not limited to academic tutors and instructors of extracurricular activities, to disclose to parents or guardians the business's policies relating to background checks of employees and the type of background check conducted, and exempts certain child care and medical facilities from this requirement.

Last Action: Chapter 159, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1855 (Melendez) Land surveying: field survey record.**

Includes determining the position of an easement within the practice of land surveying, and requires a licensed land surveyor or a licensed civil engineer to file a record of a field survey relating to an easement if the points or lines set during the performance of a field survey of any parcel described in any easement are not shown on those maps or records of survey.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1859 (Maienschein) Professional fiduciaries: professional corporations.**

Authorizes the creation of licensed professional fiduciary corporations.

Last Action: Held in Senate Judiciary Committee.

**AB 1886 (Eggman) Medical Board of California.**

Requires the Medical Board of California to post indefinitely on its Web site certain data related to physician and surgeon discipline (a revocation, suspension, probation, surrender of a license by the licensee in relation to a disciplinary action or investigation,

or other equivalent action taken against the licensee by MBC or a board of another state or jurisdiction) that is currently taken down after 10 years, reduces the amount of time from 10 years to three years for posting of citation information, and reduces the amount of time from ten years to five years for posting settlement information.

Last Action: Chapter 285, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1890 (Chau) Athletic trainers.**

Establishes certification and training requirements for athletic trainers and prohibits individuals from calling themselves athletic trainers unless they meet those requirements.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 1904 (Bonilla) Massage therapists: contact information.**

Requires a certified massage therapist or certified massage practitioner to notify the California Massage Therapy Council (Council) of his or her primary e-mail address, if any, and notify the Council within 30 days of any change to the primary e-mail address.

Last Action: Held in Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee.

**AB 1907 (Ridley-Thomas) Use fuel tax: natural gas: gallon equivalent.**

Requires compressed and liquefied natural gas sold as motor vehicle fuels to be metered, labeled, and taxed in units of gasoline- and diesel-gallon equivalents, respectively.

Last Action: Chapter 805, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 1918 (Williams) Air conditioner systems.**

Requires the Contractors State License Board to develop a system to track air conditioner appliance sales and installations and to ensure that air conditioner appliance systems are installed according to applicable building codes and with the necessary permits, and requires the Public Utilities Commission to establish an incentive program for contractors and local governments to improve the verification of building code compliance and acceptance of air conditioner appliance systems following installation.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Energy: design and construction standards.

**AB 1926 (Bonilla) Electronic and appliance repair: service dealers.**

Declares that a statement or advertisement is considered untrue or misleading if it does not contain the name and address of the business enterprise as shown on its service dealer's state registration certificate or the business telephone number as listed in a local telephone directory.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 1972 (Jones) Respiratory care practitioners.**

Requires an applicant for licensure as a respiratory care practitioner (RCP) to pass the national registered respiratory therapist examination, unless the applicant provides

evidence that he/she passed the national certified respiratory therapist examination prior to January 1, 2015, and there is no evidence of discipline against the practitioner; and authorizes the Respiratory Care Board to extend the dates an applicant may perform as an RCP applicant for up to six months under specified circumstances.  
Last Action: Chapter 179, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2018 (Bocanegra) Real estate licensees: fictitious business names.**

Revises the requirements for the use of fictitious business names by real estate licensees to authorize the use of “team names” subject to specified requirements, and specifies that this bill’s provisions shall not be construed to limit or change a real estate broker’s duties to supervise a salesperson.

Last Action: Chapter 892, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2024 (Bonilla) Professional fiduciaries.**

Authorizes the Professional Fiduciaries Bureau (Bureau) to establish a retired status license; prohibits a professional fiduciary from practicing with a retired or cancelled license; provides that an expired professional fiduciary license that is not renewed within three years shall not be renewed, restored, or reinstated; clarifies the Bureau’s authority to investigate any professional fiduciary with a retired, inactive, canceled, or suspended license; and makes technical, updating and conforming changes.

Last Action: Chapter 336, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2077 (Allen) Charitable organizations: enforcement.**

Requires money in the Registry of Charitable Trusts Fund to be used by the Attorney General to enforce the registration and reporting requirements of commercial charitable fundraisers, pursuant to the Supervision of Trustees and Fundraisers for Charitable Purposes Act.

Last Action: Chapter 465, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2102 (Ting) Licensees: data collection.**

Requires the Board of Registered Nursing, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians, the Physician Assistant Board, and the Respiratory Care Board of California to collect demographic data on their respective licensees and provide that data to the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development.

Last Action: Chapter 420, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2131 (Morrell) Pharmacy licenses: letters of reprimand.**

Authorizes the Board of Pharmacy (BOP) to issue a pharmacist or pharmacy technician license concurrently with a public letter of reprimand for those applicants who have committed minor violations that BOP deems not to merit a license denial or probationary license.

Last Action: Held in Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee.

**AB 2143 (Williams) Clinical laboratories: chiropractors.**

Exempts certain Doctors of Chiropractic (DC) who perform specified laboratory tests from clinical laboratory requirements, and requires a DC who receives an abnormal test reading to refer the applicant to his or her primary care physician

Last Action: Chapter 269, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2165 (Patterson) Professions and vocations: licenses.**

Preempts existing licensing and examination laws for Department of Consumer Affairs boards, bureaus, commissions, and committees and instead requires them to review applications and issue licenses within 45 days and administer state-specific examinations six times per year.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 2169 (Cooley) Business and professions.**

Reaffirms existing law defining when a real estate agent may be classified as an independent contractor.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Insurance Committee.

**AB 2183 (Bocanegra) Nursing.**

Requires the Board of Registered Nursing to take specified actions and issue regulations that address equivalency of education for those already working as a nurse outside California, and clarify whether and to what extent prior professional experience may be applied for purposes of meeting licensure requirements.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 2198 (Levine) Mental health professionals: suicide prevention training.**

Requires Psychologists, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists, Licensed Education Psychologists, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, and Licensed Professional Clinical Counselors to complete either 15 or more hours of coursework during a degree program, or six or more hours of continuing education coursework as part of license renewal, in suicide assessment, management and treatment, depending on the professional's date of graduation.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 2213 (Eggman) Behavioral health care licensees.**

Revises the current education and curriculum requirements for licensure as a Marriage and Family Therapist and Professional Clinical Counselor for out-of-state applicants who are applying for licensure on or after January 1, 2016.

Last Action: Chapter 387, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2214 (Fox) Emergency room physicians and surgeons: continuing medical education: geriatric care.**

Enacts the Dolores H. Fox Act to require the Medical Board of California to consider including a course in geriatric care for emergency room physicians and surgeons as part of its continuing education requirements.

Last Action: Chapter 422, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2220 (Daly) Private security services: private patrol operators.**

Authorizes a licensed Private Patrol Operator (PPO) to be the registered owner of a firearm and establishes procedures for a PPO to assign its firearms to its employees who are licensed to carry firearms, and requires, as a condition of licensure, a PPO to have a liability insurance policy on file with the Bureau of Security and Investigative Services, as specified, effective July 1, 2016,.

Last Action: Chapter 423, Statutes of 2014

**AB 2227 (Quirk) Building standards: solar energy systems.**

Requires the California Building Standards Commission to adopt and publish standards for the construction, installation, and alteration of solar energy systems no later than July 1, 2015.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Citizens Oversight Board: implementation.

**AB 2270 (Ting) California Building Standards Commission: advisory panels.**

Authorizes the California Building Standards Commission to appoint advisory panel members from the energy- and resource-efficiency professions.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**AB 2282 (Gatto) Building standards: recycled water systems.**

Requires the California Building Standards Commission to adopt mandatory building standards for the installation of recycled water systems in newly constructed residential, commercial, and public buildings for the 2019 building code.

Last Action: Chapter 606, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2312 (Nestande and Olsen) Metal theft.**

Requires a junk dealer or recycler to request to receive metal theft alert notifications from an Internet-based theft alert system and requires a junk dealer or recycler to provide a statement that they have requested to receive theft alert notifications when seeking a weighmaster license.

Last Action: Chapter 608, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2346 (Gonzalez) Physician and surgeon assistance program.**

Authorizes the Medical Board of California to establish a voluntary and confidential program to aid physicians struggling with substance abuse, mental health concerns, or other issues, and specifies the program is to be modeled after the State Bar's Lawyer Assistance Program.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 2368 (Wagner) Civil law: obligations: sports memorabilia.**

Revise the definition of "collectible" by increasing the price of the sports item sold or offered for sale to \$15 or more.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Civil law: libel: damages.

**AB 2376 (Weber) State construction projects: insurance.**

Eliminates a contractor's \$25,000 minimum deductible for an insurance policy issued under the Department of General Services' master builders' risk insurance program, and instead requires the deductible amount be outlined in the request for bids or proposals for a state contracting project.

Last Action: Chapter 115, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2396 (Bonta) Convictions: expungement: licenses.**

Prohibits boards within the Department of Consumer Affairs from denying a professional license based solely on a criminal conviction that has been withdrawn, set aside or dismissed by the court.

Last Action: Chapter 737, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2414 (Ting) Parking facilities: electric vehicle charging.**

Specifies that the use of electricity by state government and other government entities, state officers and employees, or other persons for the charging of an electric vehicle in a department maintained or joint use motor vehicle parking facility is not a gift of public funds as prohibited by the California Constitution.

Last Action: Chapter 215, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2484 (Gordon) Healing arts: telehealth.**

Requires a healthcare provider to verbally inform a patient about the use of telehealth and obtain and record the patient's verbal or written consent in the patient's medical record.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 2503 (Hagman) Repossessors.**

Revises the Collateral Recovery Act to prohibit buy-here-pay-here dealers from using unlicensed repossessioners and knowing submissions of false reports, among other reforms, and exempts repossessed vehicles from certain registration requirements.

Last Action: Chapter 390, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2540 (Dababneh) Real estate licenses.**

Requires real estate brokers and real estate salespersons to supply the Bureau of Real Estate (BRE) with valid contact information, including a current mailing address, electronic mail address, and telephone number, as part of their examination and license applications, and to inform BRE of any change in the broker or salesperson's contact information within 30 days.

Last Action: Chapter 295, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2598 (Hagman) Department of Consumer Affairs: administrative expenses.**

Adjusts the calculation by which the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) may charge its constituent boards, bureaus, committees, programs, and commissions a pro rata cost for DCA's administrative expenses.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 2605 (Bonilla) Pharmacy: third-party logistics providers.**

Creates a license for third party logistics providers (3PL) and nonresident 3PL providers who handle and transport dangerous drugs and devices, subject to regulation by the Board of Pharmacy.

Last Action: Chapter 507, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2624 (Medina) False advertising: Made in North America.**

Makes it unlawful to sell or offer for sale in this state any product that contains the words "Made in North America," "North American Made," or similar words on the product or its container unless all of the product was made in the United States, Canada, or Mexico.

Last Action: Held on Senate floor.

**AB 2656 (Jones) Petroleum: labeling.**

Requires the Division of Measurement Standards within the Department of Food and Agriculture to annually estimate and post online the cost per gallon of motor fuel resulting from compliance with California's Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction regulations, and requires wholesale motor fuel invoices, product transfer documents, and retail gasoline pumps to publicize that estimated cost.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**AB 2667 (Bloom) Rental-purchase agreements: electronic devices: monitoring technology.**

Amends the Karnette Rental-Purchase Act to require a lessor to give clear and prominent notice to a consumer and obtain their express consent when selling an electronic device that has geophysical location tracking (GPS) technology installed by the lessor, prohibits the lessor from using, selling, or sharing GPS technology for any purpose other than the repossession of the electronic device when there is a violation of the rental-purchase agreement, and prohibits a lessor from using or installing monitoring technology on an electronic device for any purpose other than to provide remote technical assistance when requested by the consumer.

Last Action: Chapter 426, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2739 (Committee on Business, Professions and Consumer Protection) Massage therapy.**

Extends the operation of the California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC) until January 1, 2019 and requires CAMTC to be reviewed by the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**AB 2740 (Bonilla) Bureau of Electronic and Appliance Repair, Home Furnishings, and Thermal Insulation.**

Requires the Bureau of Electronic and Appliance Repair, Home Furnishings and Thermal Insulation (BEARHFTI) to be subject to review by the Legislature before January 1, 2019; extends until January 1, 2019, the sunset date for registration, investigation, and enforcement of service contractors and service dealers; and requests that BEARHFTI report on specified concerns to the Legislature by July 1, 2015.  
Last Action: Chapter 428, Statutes of 2014.

**AB 2741 (Bonilla) Professional Fiduciaries Bureau.**

Extends the sunset date on the Professional Fiduciaries Bureau from January 1, 2015 to January 1, 2019.  
Last Action: Chapter 344, Statutes of 2014.

**ACA 5 (Grove) Abortion: parental notification.**

Requires a physician and surgeon, prior to performing an abortion on an unemancipated minor, to either deliver written notice to the parent of the minor or have received a waiver of parental notice from the parent of the minor or from the court, as specified, and requires the physician and surgeon to provide specified information to the State Department of Public Health.  
Last Action: Held in Assembly Health Committee.

**ACR 101 (Jones-Sawyer) Pawnbrokers and secondhand dealers: Internet transactions.**

Requests the California Department of Justice to convene stakeholder meetings in 2014 with representatives from law enforcement, prosecutors, the secondhand dealer and pawnbroker industry, and interested members of the public, to identify changes in current law which would allow secondhand dealers and pawnbrokers to conduct Internet-based business.  
Last Action: Chapter 154, Statutes of 2014

**SB 12 (Corbett) Consumer affairs.**

Creates the Made in California Program within the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) to promote products manufactured in California, and authorizes GO-Biz to develop and adopt standards that would permit a company to represent that a product is made in California.

Last Action: Chapter 541, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 62 (Lieu) Coroners: reporting requirements: prescription drug use.**

Requires a coroner to report to the Medical Board of California when he or she receives information indicating that a death was caused by a Schedule II, III, or IV drug, as specified, until January 1, 2018.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 119 (Ron Calderon) Crematories: burning of flags.**

Authorizes a crematory to incinerate an American flag or flags separately from human remains within one week before or after Memorial Day, Flag Day, or Independence Day, and requires a crematory to maintain a record of all flags incinerated.

Last Action: Chapter 205, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 124 (Corbett) Human remains: Abbot Archimandrite Theodor Micka.**

Allows the local registrar of births and deaths in Alameda County to issue a disposition permit for the burial of the Abbot, Archimandrite Theodor Micka on the grounds of the Holy Cross Monastery.

Last Action: Chapter 5, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 152 (Roth) Licensed professionals: engineers: geologists: geophysicists.**

Deletes the current provisions allowing a temporary authorization to practice engineering, geology, and geophysics, and requires the use of a written contract when contracting to provide geological or geophysical services, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 178, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 198 (Lieu) Physical Therapy Board of California.**

Reorganizes and recasts the Physical Therapy Act (Act), eliminates redundant and outdated provisions, updates and clarifies numerous provisions, makes other technical and conforming changes, and renumbers various sections within the Act.

Last Action: Chapter 389, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 202 (Galgiani) Automotive repair.**

Authorizes the Bureau of Automotive Repair to regulate businesses that change and repair tires as an automotive repair dealer.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 204 (Corbett) Prescription drugs: labeling.**

Requires the Board of Pharmacy (BOP) to survey pharmacists and electronic health record vendors to determine utilization of standardized prescription directions for use adopted pursuant to BOP regulations.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 205 (Corbett) Prescription drugs: labeling.**

Deletes and recasts existing law on labeling requirements for prescription containers, and requires, beginning January 1, 2016, the following information currently required to be included on the label of a prescription container to be printed in 12-point sans serif typeface: 1) the manufacturer's trade or generic name of the drug and the name of the manufacturer, as specified; 2) directions for the use of the drug; 3) name of the patient or patients; 4) strength of the drug or drugs dispensed; and 5) the condition or purpose for which the drug was prescribed, if indicated on the prescription.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 218 (Yee) Healing arts: California traditional Chinese medicine traumatologist certification.**

Authorizes the creation of a non-profit California Traditional Chinese Medicine Traumatology Council (Council), requires the Council to develop standards for the education and training of applicants, and authorizes the Council to issue certificates to qualified applicants to practice as a California certified traditional Chinese medicine traumatologist and to discipline certificate holders for specified violations.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**SB 243 (Wyland) Professional clinical counselors.**

Revises the current training and education requirements for licensed professional clinical counselors in order for them to complete the training required for treatment of couples or families during a degree program, rather than after the program.

Last Action: Chapter 465, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 256 (Lieu) Trampoline courts: safety inspection.**

Requires the Division of Occupational Safety and Health within the Department of Industrial Relations to formulate and propose rules and regulations that establish a state safety program for the inspection of trampoline courts.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 261 (Monning) Contractors: fraudulent use of license.**

Authorizes the Contractors State License Board (CSLB) to take administrative action against a licensed or unlicensed person for the improper use of a contractor's license, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 163, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 262 (Monning) Contractors.**

Requires the person qualifying on behalf of a contracting firm to be responsible for exercising direct supervision and control in order to secure compliance with the Contractors State License Law, and provides that failure to exercise direct supervision and control constitutes a cause for disciplinary action that is punishable as a misdemeanor.

Last Action: Chapter 180, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 263 (Monning) Contractors: unlicensed activity.**

Clarifies the misdemeanor penalty for a person engaging in the business of a contractor to also include a person who has never been a licensed contractor, or a person who was licensed but who acts under a license that is inactive, expired, revoked, or under suspension for any reason.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Private employment: public transit employees.

**SB 269 (Hill) Prepaid rental listing service.**

Expands the enforcement powers of the Bureau of Real Estate over prepaid rental listing services (PRLS) licensees, authorizes consumers harmed by PRLS providers to seek compensation from the Consumer Recovery Account, increases application fees for the PRLS license to better fund the Account, and requires licensees to provide prospective clients with a written notice of the consumer's rights.

Last Action: Chapter 436, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 272 (Corbett) Advertising and solicitations: government and military endorsements.**

Restricts the use of military or government terms, symbols, and content that reasonably could be interpreted or construed as implying connection, approval, or endorsement of any product or service.

Last Action: Chapter 695, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 294 (Emmerson) Sterile drug products.**

Expands the types of sterile compounded drugs for which a license is required, deletes the licensing exemption for certain types of pharmacies, and requires inspection of nonresident sterile compounding pharmacies by the Board of Pharmacy.

Last Action: Chapter 565, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 304 (Lieu) Healing arts: boards.**

Revises the Medical Practice Act to transfer inspectors and medical consultants from the Medical Board of California (MBC) to the Division of Investigation within the Department of Consumer Affairs, extends the sunset date of MBC by four years, and amends the Veterinary Practice Act to extend its sunset date by two years.

Last Action: Chapter 515, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 305 (Lieu) Healing arts: boards.**

Extends until January 1, 2018, the sunset dates for the provisions establishing the

Naturopathic Medicine Committee, the Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensers Board (SLPAHADB), the Board of Occupational Therapy, the Physical Therapy Board of California (PTB), the Board of Optometry (BOO), and the Respiratory Care Board of California (RCB), which are regulated by the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA); extends the term of the executive officers of the PTB, SLPAHADB, RCB, and the BOO; provides that certain acts of sexual abuse or misconduct may result in denial or revocation of licensure, or may be deemed unprofessional conduct by the BOO; specifies that any board, committee or bureau regulated by DCA is authorized to receive specified criminal records needed to complete an application for licensure; exempts certain individuals performing pulmonary tests in specified hospitals in Los Angeles County from certain licensure requirements; and subjects specified boards to review by the appropriate legislative policy committees, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 516, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 306 (Torres) Nursing: licensing criteria.**

Permits group practices to dispense prescription drugs through an automated drug delivery system.

Last Action: Held in the Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**SB 308 (Lieu) Professions and vocations.**

Extends until January 1, 2018, the provisions of the Interior Design Law and the Board of Guide Dogs for the Blind; extends until January 1, 2016, the provisions of the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology and the term of its executive officer; and makes various other technical changes and improvements to those provisions.

Last Action: Chapter 333, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 309 (Lieu) State Athletic Commission.**

Extends, until January 1, 2016, the operation of the California State Athletic Commission (Commission), which regulates professional and amateur boxing, kickboxing, and martial arts contests and exhibitions; enacts fee increases and spending restrictions to ensure the financial sustainability and appropriate operation of the Commission; deletes the training gymnasium license and creates a professional trainer's license; and expands the Commission's authority to delegate and revoke regulatory oversight of amateur contests.

Last Action: Chapter 370, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 315 (Lieu) Contractors.**

Clarifies advertising provisions for unlicensed persons seeking work; extends the period during which the Contractors State License Board (CSLB) must initiate disciplinary action against a licensee upon a finding by the Labor Commissioner of a willful and deliberate labor code violation; and makes other changes to CSLB enforcement provisions, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 392, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 352 (Pavley) Medical assistants: supervision.**

Authorizes medical assistants to perform technical supportive services in any medical setting upon specific authorization of a physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or certified nurse-midwife without a physician and surgeon on the premises.

Last Action: Chapter 286, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 445 (Hill) Pharmacies: advertising: controlled substances.**

Prohibits pharmacies from advertising the sale or dispensing of controlled substances.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue:

Underground storage tanks: hazardous substances: petroleum: groundwater and surface water contamination.

**SB 465 (Correa) Packaging and labeling: containers: slack fill.**

Revises the definition for "nonfunctional slack fill" prohibited in packaged goods to require that nonfunctional slack fill be substantially less than the allowed capacity, and clarifies a particular exemption to require the actual size of the product be clearly and conspicuously depicted on any side of the exterior packaging except the bottom.

Last Action: Chapter 429, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 482 (Hill) Point-of-sale systems.**

Deletes the January 1, 2014, sunset date on a provision of existing law allowing local officials to verify the accuracy of point-of-sale transaction systems.

Last Action: Chapter 166, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 484 (Wyland) Tax preparers.**

Revises the composition of the California Tax Education Council (CTEC), authorizes CTEC to deny, suspend, or revoke a tax preparer's registration for specified violations, and makes other related changes to the Tax Preparers Law.

Last Action: Chapter 660, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 485 (Ron Calderon) Weighmasters: junk dealers and recyclers.**

Requires a junk dealer or recycler to submit additional information regarding its junk dealer business to the Department of Food and Agriculture (DFA) when applying for a weighmaster's license or a renewal license; requires the DFA to complete an investigation of the information on the application or renewal within a specified period of time and revoke the license if the information submitted in the application or renewal is materially inaccurate; increases the fees that junk dealers or recyclers pay for each fixed location; and sunsets these provisions on January 1, 2019.

Last Action: Chapter 518, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 491 (Hernandez) Nurse practitioners.**

Permits a nurse practitioner (NP) to practice independently after a period of physician supervision if the NP has national certification and liability insurance, and authorizes the NP to perform various other specified tasks related to the practice of nursing without protocols.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 492 (Hernandez) Optometrist: practice: licensure.**

Authorizes an optometrist to administer influenza and herpes zoster virus (shingles) immunizations for persons 18 years of age and older after completing a training program.

Last Action: Held on Assembly Floor.

**SB 493 (Hernandez) Pharmacy practice.**

Expands the pharmacist scope of practice to recognize an "advanced practice pharmacist"; permits pharmacists to furnish certain hormonal contraceptives, nicotine replacement products, and prescription medications for travel; and authorizes pharmacists to independently initiate and administer certain vaccines and treatments for severe allergic reactions.

Last Action: Chapter 469, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 500 (Lieu) Medical practice: pain management.**

Requires the Medical Board of California to update pain management case review standards by July 1, 2015, and every five years thereafter, as specified.

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Drug Medi-Cal.

**SB 562 (Galgiani) Dentists: mobile or portable dental units.**

Requires the Dental Board of California to develop registration and operating regulations for mobile dental units and dental practices that routinely use portable dental units, and deletes restrictions limiting dentists to operating only one mobile dental clinic.

Last Action: Chapter 624, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 570 (DeSaulnier) Advanced Alcohol and Drug Licensing Act.**

Establishes a board within the Department of Consumer Affairs to regulate drug and alcohol counselors.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 578 (Wyland) Behavioral sciences: records retention.**

Requires a licensed marriage and family therapist, a licensed educational psychologist, a licensed clinical social worker, and a licensed professional clinical counselor to retain a patient or client's health service record for seven years, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 312, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 598 (Hill) Biosimilars.**

Permits a pharmacist to substitute a biological pharmaceutical with a biosimilar pharmaceutical in the same manner as generic drugs are substituted, and for prescriptions filled prior to January 1, 2017, requires the pharmacist to notify the prescriber.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 600 (Lieu) Drugs.**

Repeals provisions of current pharmacy law to conform to the federal Drug Quality and Security Act, declares that any foreign dangerous drug that is not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration or that is obtained outside the state-licensed supply chain is misbranded, and provides that anyone who purchases that drug is guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not more than \$10,000.  
Last Action: Chapter 492, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 610 (Jackson) Franchises.**

Revises various provisions of the California Franchise Relations Act with respect to termination or transfer of a franchise, as well as the right of association among franchisees.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 662 (Galgiani) Structural pest control operators: financial responsibility.**

Increases the minimum limit for liability insurance for a structural pest control company to \$500,000; increases the amount of the surety bond required to maintain a license or company registration to \$12,500; and increases the upper limit of a surety bond required for issuance, reissuance, or restoration of a license or company registration, after a suspension or revocation, to \$25,000.

Last Action: Chapter 218, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 669 (Huff) Emergency medical care: epinephrine auto-injectors.**

Permits a prehospital emergency medical care person or lay rescuer to obtain and use an epinephrine auto-injector in emergency situations with certification of training, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 725, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 670 (Steinberg) Physicians and surgeons: drug prescribing privileges: investigation.**

Authorizes the Medical Board of California to inspect and copy a deceased patient's medical records, clarifies language relating to unprofessional conduct, and permits an interim suspension order to place restrictions on a physician's prescribing privileges, as specified

Last Action: Chapter 399, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 676 (Block) Real estate records: unlawful destruction.**

Authorizes the Bureau of Real Estate (BRE) to suspend or revoke a real estate license if the licensee knowingly destroys, alters, conceals, mutilates, or falsifies any of the books, accounts, or records that are required to be maintained or are sought by the Commissioner of the BRE, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 349, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 679 (Berryhill) Licensees: reporting requirements.**

Revises the monetary threshold for a licensed engineer or land surveyor to report a civil action settlement or administrative action to the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and Geologists (Board) from "\$50,000 or greater" to "greater than \$50,000;"

and requires a licensed engineer or land surveyor to report to the Board any civil action judgment or binding arbitration award or administrative action of \$25,000 or greater.  
Last Action: Chapter 471, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 686 (Jackson) Vehicles: vehicle dealers.**

Prohibits a vehicle dealer from selling a used vehicle if the dealer knows or should have known that the vehicle is subject to a manufacturer's safety recall and does not correct the defect, and provides that a violation of these provisions is actionable under the Consumer Legal Remedies Act, the Unfair Competition Law, or any other applicable statute or federal law.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee.

**SB 757 (Berryhill) Junk dealers and recyclers.**

Authorizes a junk dealer or recycler to accept as valid seller identification a passport from any country or a *Matricula Consular* issued by Mexico when buying newspaper or California Redemption Value containers, and clarifies that the definition of a "secondhand dealer" does not include a "junk dealer."

Last Action: This bill was substantially amended to address an unrelated issue: Groundwater management.

**SB 762 (Hill) Secondhand goods: lost, stolen, or embezzled items.**

Clarifies the interests of licensed pawnbrokers and secondhand dealers relating to the seizure and disposition of property during a criminal investigation or case.

Last Action: Chapter 318, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 809 (DeSaulnier and Steinberg) Controlled substances: reporting.**

Establishes a funding mechanism to update and maintain the Controlled Substance Utilization Review and Evaluation System (CURES) and Prescription Drug Monitoring Program, requires all prescribing health care practitioners to apply to access CURES information, and establishes processes and procedures for regulating prescribing licensees through CURES and securing private information.

Last Action: Chapter 400, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 821 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development) Healing arts.**

Makes several technical and noncontroversial changes to provisions within the Business and Professions Code relating to the regulation of the Dental Board of California, Board of Optometry Board of Behavioral Sciences, as well as dental hygienists regulated under the Welfare and Institutions Code.

Last Action: Chapter 473, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 822 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development) Professions and vocations.**

Makes several technical and noncontroversial changes to provisions within the Business and Professions Code relating to the regulation of various professions,

including those overseen by the California Board of Accountancy, the Contractors' State License Board, the Board of Guide Dogs for the Blind, and the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors and Geologists.

Last Action: Chapter 319, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 823 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development)**

**Professions and vocations: licensure.**

Revises the qualifications for certified public accountant licensure in order to smooth the transition to the new requirements for some applicants, and reestablishes certain provisions regarding the administration of the Transcript Reimbursement Fund operated by the Court Reporters Board of California.

Last Action: Chapter 474, Statutes of 2013.

**SB 912 (Mitchell) State property: vending machines.**

Repeals the 2015 sunset date for existing law requiring operators of vending machines on state property to offer at least 35% of food, and approximately 66% of beverages, in a vending machine to meet accepted nutritional guidelines and other nutritional standards, as specified, and makes other technical or nonsubstantive changes.

Last Action: Chapter 571, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 960 (Morrell) Pharmacy.**

Authorizes the Board of Pharmacy (BOP) to issue a letter of admonishment to applicants for licensures who have committed violations of law that BOP deems does not merit license denial or probationary status.

Last Action: Chapter 247, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 962 (Leno) Smartphones.**

Requires smartphones manufactured after July 1, 2015, and sold in California to contain a technological solution at the time of sale that will render the essential features of the smartphone inoperable when not in the possession of the authorized user, and also provides a civil penalty for violations and limits retail liability if the solution is circumvented.

Last Action: Chapter 275, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 993 (Mitchell) Healing arts: dieticians.**

Modifies educational and training requirements for a dietetic technician, registered (DTR), authorizes a registered dietitian (RD) to perform additional duties, and makes additional changes to the practice authorizations for a DTR and RD, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 622, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1000 (Monning) Public health: sugar-sweetened beverages: safety warnings.**

Establishes the Sugar-Sweetened Beverages Safety Warning Act, to be administered by the Department of Public Health and requires a safety warning on sugar sweetened beverages as specified. Requires the safety warning to be printed on, or affixed to, a beverage container, vending machine, or self-service dispenser. Requires the label to

be posted in a place that is easily visible at the point-of-purchase of an establishment where a beverage dispensing machine is not self-serve.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Health Committee.

**SB 1012 (Wyland) Healing arts: licensure requirements.**

Increases from five to six the number of hours which a marriage and family therapist (MFT) trainee or intern, and a professional clinical counselor (PCC) intern, may count towards their weekly supervision requirement.

Last Action: Chapter 435, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1014 (Jackson) Pharmaceutical waste: home generated: collection.**

Requires the Board of Pharmacy, in consultation with the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery and the State Department of Public Health, to adopt regulations to implement drug takeback programs for the collection and destruction of home-generated pharmaceutical waste within 18 months of the enactment of federal regulations regarding the collection of unwanted or expired controlled substances from the public.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 1019 (Leno) Upholstered furniture: flame retardant chemicals.**

Requires upholstered furniture to include a label indicating whether the product has added flame retardant chemicals. This bill also directs the Bureau of Electronic and Appliance Repair, Home Furnishings and Thermal Insulation to ensure compliance with labeling and documentation and to assess fines for violations.

Last Action: Chapter 862, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1027 (Hill) Booking photographs: commercial use.**

Prohibits the solicitation, requirement or acceptance of a fee to remove, connect, modify or to refrain from publishing or otherwise disseminating a booking photograph, but exempts a public entity from the prohibition.

Last Action: Chapter 194, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1039 (Hernandez) Pharmacy.**

Makes minor updates to various pharmacy-related statutes, including allowing the delegation of additional routine, non-discretionary tasks to pharmacy technicians and intern pharmacists working in hospitals.

Last Action: Chapter 319, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1083 (Pavley) Physician assistants: disability certifications.**

Authorizes a physician assistant to certify disability for purposes of disability insurance.

Last Action: Chapter 438, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1116 (Torres) Physicians and surgeons.**

Requires the Medical Board of California and the Osteopathic Medical Board of California to develop a mechanism for a physician to make a voluntary contribution to

the Steven M. Thompson Physician Corps Loan Repayment Program at the time of application for initial licensure or biennial renewal by July 1, 2015.

Last Action: Chapter 439, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1159 (Lara) Professions and vocations: license applicants: individual tax identification number.**

Prohibits licensing boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs from denying licensure to an applicant based on his or her citizenship or immigration status, and requires a licensing board and the State Bar of California to require, by January 1, 2016, that an applicant for licensure provide his or her individual taxpayer identification number or a social security number for an initial or renewal license.

Last Action: Chapter 752, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1226 (Correa) Veterans: professional licensing.**

Requires the Department of Consumer Affairs' boards and bureaus to expedite applications from honorably discharged veterans, and permits a person registered and hired as a proprietary private security officer to submit a verification of military training in lieu of completing a course in security officer skills, as specified.

Last Action: Chapter 657, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1242 (Lieu) Automotive repair: Bureau of Automotive Repair.**

Subjects the powers and duties of the Bureau of Automotive Repair to review by the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature as if these provisions were scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2019, and makes technical, updating and correcting changes to the Automotive Repair Act.

Last Action: Chapter 255, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1243 (Lieu) Professions and vocations.**

Increases the transparency of information distributed by the Department of Consumer Affairs; requires the Office of Administrative Hearings to submit specified reports to the Legislature annually; enhances unlicensed advertising enforcement; and, establishes a board member mentor program, among other things; extends until January 1, 2017 the provisions establishing the Veterinary Medical Board and the term of the executive officer; extends the Certified Common Interest Development Manager program and the Tax Preparer program until January 1, 2019.

Last Action: Chapter 395, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1244 (Lieu) Structural Pest Control Board.**

Extends the sunset date on the Structural Pest Control Board until January 1, 2019, and makes numerous technical and nonsubstantive changes to the Structural Pest Control Law.

Last Action: Chapter 560, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1245 (Lieu) The Dental Hygiene Committee of California.**

Extends the operation of the Dental Hygiene Committee of California within the jurisdiction of the Dental Board of California and provides for an extension of the

appointments of the committee members and the executive officer until January 1, 2019.

Last Action: Chapter 396, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1246 (Lieu) Acupuncture.**

Extends the sunset date of the California Acupuncture Board (CAB) to January 1, 2017, revises acupuncture program approval requirements, and extends the sunset date of CAB's authority to appoint an executive officer to January 1, 2017.

Last Action: Chapter 397, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1247 (Lieu) Private postsecondary education: California Private Postsecondary Education Act of 2009.**

Extends the sunset date for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the California Private Postsecondary Education Act, from January 1, 2015, until January 1, 2017, and provides for statutory changes to the protections provided to students and the requirements placed on private postsecondary educational institutions.

Last Action: Chapter 840, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1256 (Mitchell) Medical services: credit.**

Extends existing consumer protections regarding lines of credit for dental services to all types of medical or healing arts services by requiring a licensee to provide a patient with a treatment plan, a disclosure form, and information about third-party payment coverage, and also establishes language and competency requirements.

Last Action: Chapter 256, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1262 (Correa) Medical marijuana.**

Creates the Bureau of Medical Marijuana Regulation in the Department of Consumer Affairs, and establishes a licensing and regulatory framework for the cultivation, transportation, testing, and sale of medical marijuana.

Last Action: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

**SB 1326 (Roth) Hearing aids: warranty: work order or receipt.**

Clarifies hearing aid warranty provisions by requiring a retailer to provide written warranty beginning and expiration dates from the time the hearing aids are initially delivered to the buyer; clarifies the hearing aid warranty tolling period after repair or service; and requires the seller to provide a work order or receipt with the date the warranty period resumes and the revised expiration date of the warranty adjusted to reflect the suspension of the warranty period during repair or service.

Last Action: Chapter 226, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1350 (Lara, Wolk) Baby diaper changing accommodations.**

Requires the California Building Standards Commission to adopt building standards governing the installation of baby diaper changing stations in places of public accommodation for equal use by men and women.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 1358 (Wolk, Lara) Baby diaper changing stations.**

Requires buildings owned or partially owned by state or local governments, as well as other private buildings open to the public, as specified, to maintain at least one safe, sanitary, and convenient baby diaper changing station that is accessible to women and men.

Last Action: Vetoed.

**SB 1416 (Block) Dentistry: fees.**

Establishes a fee of \$525 that the Dental Board of California will assess for initial dental licensure and biennial renewal of licensure; and makes legislative findings and declarations.

Last Action: Chapter 73, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1466 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development) Health care professionals.**

Makes non-controversial, minor, non-substantive or technical changes to various provisions within the Business and Professions Code relating to the regulatory boards of the Department of Consumer Affairs.

Last Action: Chapter 316, Statutes of 2014.

**SB 1467 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development) Professions and vocations.**

Makes several non-controversial, minor, nonsubstantive or technical changes to various provisions within the Business and Professions Code relating to the regulatory boards of the Department of Consumer Affairs.

Last Action: Chapter 400, Statutes of 2014.

**SJR 22 (Block) Cruelty-free cosmetics.**

Urges the United States Congress to enact legislation that would establish reasonable guidelines for the prohibition of cosmetic product testing on animals, and further urges the federal government to mandate alternative methods to animal testing of cosmetic products.

Last Action: Chapter 73, Statutes of 2014.
